

Make The Day Special

- Kindergarten - Purchase a t-shirt in the size you imagine your child will wear when they are in 12th grade. Take a picture in that t-shirt every year at the start of the school year. Have the child hold a sign with the date and/or grade so you have it as a future reference.
- Participate in the Backpack Blessing at First Lutheran Church, which is usually held the middle of August. Check the First Lutheran website for details.
- Take a photo every year in the same place. That little tree you were standing in front of in elementary school will not be the same little tree come 12th grade.
- Start a tradition that you can maintain every year. It may be a trip to the DQ or a special evening meal or the tradition of always wearing blue the first day of school. Be creative and remember this is something you want to be able to maintain.
- Hide a “thinking of you” note in their lunch box or backpack every day for the first week of school.
- When buying school supplies, buy two of everything. Donate the extra set of supplies to a child in need. Just take to the teacher and let them know if a child is ever in need use them.
- Generate 3 simple questions that you will always use as talking points each day when you and your child meet up.

Dear God, thank you for all our dedicated teachers. For their inspiration in our lives. For their knowledge and skills. For their commitment to education. Please bless their work.

A student’s prayer (students):
Dear God, in Proverbs 23:12 you tell us, “Apply your heart to instruction and your ear to words of knowledge.” Help us to open our hearts and minds this school year, to learn about your amazing creation, and to equip ourselves to be servants in this world.
