#### Congregational Council Meeting

#### First Lutheran Church

October 10, 2023

#### A. OPENING PRAYER AND BIBLE STUDY:

The meeting was called to order by Council President Lee Rockwell at 7:00. Rod led the opening prayer and Bible Study.

#### B. APPROVE CONSENT AGENDA:

- 1. Meeting agenda
- 2. Congregational Council Minutes September 12, 2023
- 3. Parochial report
- 4. Staff reports
- 5. Committee reports
- 6. Appoint 2024 budget committee: Scott Williamson (chair), Steve Janssen, Brian Niebuhr, Wyatt Swanson, Bryan Hanson, Pastor Erin

It was moved by Bruce and seconded by Jenn that all items in the consent agenda be approved.

Scott made a clarification in the Property Committee report. The boiler repair has been completed. The boiler itself has not been replaced.

The motion passed.

# C. DISCUSSION – *Growing Young* – Chapter 3:

The group discussed the following questions (discussion items are in red):

- 1. What factors do you think create the most generational differences in our church?
  - Music contemporary vs. traditional
  - Music long hymns
  - Fewer middle schoolers
  - More members with gray hair
- 2. How does our church empathize with young people well?
  - Welcoming Statement we say it, do we live it?
  - Music Masako puts together music such that folks with all skill levels can participate.

- Music many choir members attend when the choir is scheduled to sing during a church service. Do they attend when the choir is not singing?
- It's all about connections. We need to be careful about exclusive groups.
- 3. What gets in the way of our church empathizing with teenagers and adults? Some people are not willing to make changes.
- 4. What shifts might we need to make in order to be a more hospitable place for young people's journey toward identity, belonging and purpose?
  We need to talk to our young people, realizing that initial conversations might be awkward.

#### D. OPEN COMMENTS:

a. Zach Schaffer's revised letter

Zach prepared a Letter of Deliberation, which was discussed at the meeting. "How do we honor the work of those engaged in current initiatives, while also working to engage and empower others in our congregation who aren't engaged to act upon their passions, accept responsibility for the work to be done and sustain it in a way that doesn't lead to initiatives that fizzle out?"

b. Lyle discussed the safety of the church in general. Al Williams began to put some documentation together. Who should complete that plan? This item will be added to the agenda for the November meeting.

#### E. FINANCIAL REPORT:

YTD receipts through September 30 are \$2,482 over budget; YTD expenditures through September 30 are \$19,290 under budget; YTD surplus through September 30 is \$21,771.

- Scott stated that revenues were down for the month of September, which is consistent with prior years.
- The Budget Committee has their next meeting on November 8.
- The Committee noticed that utility expenses are higher than expected. This matter will be reviewed.
- It is estimated that there will be a \$15,000-\$20,000 surplus at the end of the year.
- As of last night, there have been 114 pledges for a total of \$459,450. Fifty families that
  have automatic payments have not yet pledged. Thirty-seven families that do not have
  automatic payments have not yet pledged.
- Programs drive the budget.
- The Committee is having the appropriate individuals put policies and procedures in writing.
- The Committee is looking at segregation of duties in line with the Synod and ELA's best practices and is considering having two individuals sign the checks to protect both the church and our accountant.

#### F. ACTION AGENDA:

Associate Pastor call and compensation package congregational recommendation

It was moved by Dave and seconded by Emily to approve a recommendation for congregational approval of the calling of Pastor Andrew Kitzing for the position of Associate Pastor of Word and Sacrament at First Lutheran Church, and the recommendation of an annual financial package of salary and benefits of \$98,840. Discussion followed.

- Pastor Kitzing has fourteen years of experience.
- If the congregation votes to issue a call to Pastor Kitzing, he could be at First Lutheran to start work in mid-November.
- The proposed financial package for Pastor Kitzing is from the Synod's 2024 recommendations.
- Pastor Kitzing will be introduced to the congregation the weekend of October 21-22. An outside speaker is scheduled for the Adult Forum on October 22. Council members discussed rescheduling the outside speaker. There will be several opportunities during the weekend to meet Pastor Kitzing, so rescheduling the speaker is not necessary.

The motion passed unanimously. An announcement will be made in First Things First tomorrow morning.

Continue temporary increase in work hours for Facilities Maintenance Manager

No action is needed on the facilities maintenance manager position. The budget allows Richard to continue extra hours through mid-November and to go back to 20 hours/week for the rest of the year.

#### G. DISCUSSION AGENDA:

1. Las Abejitas update

Because of their enrollment success, First Lutheran is receiving \$2,500/month. The FLC liaison to Las Abejitas needs to meet with Kayla to discuss items such as the alarm system, etc.

2. Synod Vitality Initiative Update

Amy H. reported on the Vitality Initiative. The first task of the initiative is to delve into the history of the church to assist in discerning our congregational identity. Personal stories should be shared with members of the Vitality Initiative. A PowerPoint presentation will be developed.

3. Immanuel scholarship application

Fred Ohles prepared a grant application for \$4,500, supplemented by \$500 from the First Lutheran Church Endowment Board, to provide re-grants of \$100 per month for up to nine months to families challenged to pay to enroll a child at Las Abejitas Bilingual Education Center.

4. Staffing

If we can add it to the budget, FLC would like to add a Director of Discipleship (50% FTE) for 2024.

- H. CLOSING PRAYER: Rod led the closing prayer.
- I. ADJOURNMENT: The meeting adjourned at 9:03.

#### Special Congregational Meeting of First Lutheran Church

#### October 29, 2029

- Call to order and determination of a quorum
   Council President Lee Rockwell called the meeting to order at 12:23. Members signed in as they entered the sanctuary. President Rockwell declared that a quorum was present.
- II. Presentation by Call Committee Chair Gene Cotter

  Gene thanked the members of the Call Committee: Scott Seebohm (Council liaison who served until he moved to Virginia), Dawn Brock (served as Chair for much of the time the Committee met), Kari Hoeft, Lisa Culbertson, Dylan Fischer, and Dave Pfister (Council liaison).

The Committee started their work eighteen months ago and considered approximately twenty individuals. The Committee followed the priorities in the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) as they did their discernment. Gene read the letter sent to Council with the recommendation of Andrew Kitzing to serve as Associate Pastor of First Lutheran Church.

- III. Motion and Second to Recommend a Call to Pastor Andrew Kitzing to serve as Associate Pastor of First Lutheran Church
  It was moved by Gene Cotter and seconded by Wendy Bonaiuto to consider the Call of Andrew Kitzing as Associate Pastor of First Lutheran Church.
- IV. Discussion none
- V. Prayer Pastor Erin led the prayer.
- VI. Vote on the motion to extend the Call
  Written ballots were distributed and collected.
- VII. Count by Tellers

  The Congregation sang a hymn while the ballots were counted.
- VIII. Announcement of votes for and against
  There were 126 votes yes and 2 votes no. President Rockwell declared that the motion passed.
- IX. Motion and Second to Recommend Pastor Kitzing's Compensation Package It was moved by John Bonaiuto and seconded by Craig Heier to recommend the compensation package as presented in the meeting packet.
- X. Discussion

President Lee Rockwell discussed the details as to how the compensation and other benefits were derived from both the Synod and Portico. He then read the details of the entire compensation and benefits package.

- Since Pastor Kitzing's wife is also a Pastor, 100% of her health insurance is covered.
- One of the details of the compensation package is that up to \$18,000 is available for loan for the purchase of a home. A question was asked about how the amount of \$18,000 was determined. That amount was from revenue received from the sale of a parsonage years ago.
- Pastor Kitzing's wife, Lori, serves at Bethany in Ruskin and First Presbyterian in Superior. It was asked if Lori Kitzing would likely continue to serve due to the miles between Lincoln and Superior. To the best of our knowledge at this time, Lori Kitzing will continue to serve her churches and we will not need to make any changes to our budget for health insurance for her.
- XI. Vote on the Compensation Package motion

  The Compensation Package was voted on by a voice vote.
- XII. Declaration of results
  The motion carried.
- XIII. Next steps

Pastor Kitzing will be contacted. He will start at First Lutheran Church at the end of November before a busy Advent and Christmas season.

- XIV. Closing prayer Pastor Erin led the Closing Prayer.
- XV. Adjournment The meeting adjourned at 12:53.

- Realm Church Management: Kathleen, Mandy, and I are working on a timeline for introducing Realm Connect (app and web access) to the staff and congregation starting with orienting staff to the new software in mid-January and beginning to roll out to the congregation at the end of January with launch activities continuing through Lent.
- **Confirmation:** Our Confirmation programming, Discipleship University, continues on the first and third Wednesdays of the month. I plan and teach the content with Sharon coordinating dinner and activities. With Pastor Andrew's arrival, we will transition to him teaching after Christmas.
- Met with Las Abejitas Advisory Team on Oct. 2 as we continue to work on any items that need addressing to support Las Abejitas.
- I'm excited to be working on welcoming and onboarding of **Pastor Andrew** this month and look forward to his first weekend with us Nov. 25-26.

- o Midweek and devotional Advent theme: "Out of Time"
- We are observing the season of Advent beginning one week early on November 26. Midweek Advent services with Holden evening prayer will be Nov. 29, Dec. 6, and Dec. 13 at noon and 6:30.

Nebraska Synod Fall Gathering Conducted a 3-hour workshop on communications, upon the request of the Nebraska Synod, at the Fall Gathering in Kearney on October 25. Workshop attendees included pastors, Synod staff and one PMA. The workshop was well-received and I have been contacted by several

attendees since the workshop for consulting.

# Sharon Hardel's Report to Council October 11, 2023 - November 14, 2023

#### Highlights of the month:

Discipleship University is going very well. The youth and parents are sharing in conversation using Joe Davis' book of poetry "Remind Me Again" and related Bible stories that Pastor Erin is also pairing with parts of the Small Catechism. They seem to enjoy the meal and opening games as well. Thanks to Michalla Schartz and Linda Bogenreif who have been serving the meals. (Michalla is also doing the shopping and meal planning) We are thankful that the dishwasher has been fixed and that we can go back to using real dishes.

The Affirmation of Baptism Breakfast and worship service went well. We had lots of compliments on the stoles that the students made, so that will be continued in future years. Thanks to all those who contributed breakfast casseroles and / or pastries for the breakfast. It was nice to have a full activity center and sanctuary for these festivities.

Youth Group and Sunday morning Learning is ongoing. Several youth helped over fall break with food distribution at the Center for People and Nov. 12 we will provide lunch at the Lutheran Center and then one of the students will lead us in a Bible Study and scavenger hunt around campus.

I attended 2 choral concerts at South East and a Band Competition at East to cheer on several of our youth. Gay Sutter joined me as part of the First Lutheran Pep Squad for one concert and the Band Competition. Kristi Fisher joined us at the Band Competition. I met High School seniors for coffee and conversation on Nov. 2 since they were off school. November 10-12 offers a Middle School retreat at Camp, we have 1 youth registered and 3 on the waiting list.

I registered 10 youth, 2 young adults, and 3 adults to attend the ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans in July 2024 and was able to secure flights for \$388.10 / person for the trip. We will begin fundraising efforts with the First Friday Jazz event on Jan. 5...Stay tuned.

I secured 10 spots for the Middle School summer trip to Louisville, KY in June of 2024 and am collecting registration forms from youth. It looks like we will need to add a few more spots once everyone turns in their forms. I believe we will have at least 9 youth and 3 adults going on the trip.

I met with the Lincoln Youth Workers on Oct. 12 for conversation and to work on plans for upcoming youth activities. Our next joint event will be Jan. 5 – a lock in.

I participated in a Safe Sanctuary Synod webinar on Oct. 19. Look for a training session for all volunteers working with children / youth in January as well as renewed background checks for many to stay in compliance with our congregational policy.

I attended the Leadership Gathering in Kearney Oct. 23 – 25. I got to spend some time talking with and getting to know Pastor Andrew as well as many other pastors and deacons in the Nebraska Synod.
