On Friday, December 6, seven soloists from the Nebraska Jazz Orchestra will perform at the First Friday Jazz concert at First. This special Jazz Septet, led by Ed Love, includes Ed Love on woodwinds, Bob Krueger on trumpet, Pete Madsen on trombone, Peter Bouffard on guitar, Tom Harvill on piano, Andy Hall on bass and Greg Ahl on drums. As eastern Nebraska's premier "big band," this ensemble is the largest to appear in the 13-year history of First Friday Jazz. The concert runs from 11:30 AM to 1:00 PM with free admission, though donations are appreciated, and lunch will be available for purchase. Attendees are encouraged to bring non-perishable food items for the Lincoln Lutheran Food Pantry.
